Droitwich Spa railway station was opened in 1852 as part of the Oxford-Worcester-Wolverhampton Line by the Oxford, Worcester and Wolverhampton Railway, which was later taken over by the Great Western Railway. Originally it was called Droitwich. The station was rebuilt by John Corbett in 1899 and was renamed Droitwich Spa.

A short branch line to Stoke Works Junction on the Midland Railway's main line between Birmingham New Street and Gloucester was also built in 1852 and this line is now used by London Midland services between Hereford and Birmingham New Street.
